Marian Schultz Memorial Environmental Scholarship (\$750, awarded odd numbered years)

This scholarship is available to any
Nebraska high school senior with special
interest in prairie and soil
conservation. The student must submit
the following:

1. Evidence of prairie and soil conservation practices using field experience or an 800–1,000 word essay that demonstrates the Applicants' understanding of the topic
