- Scholarships will be given to students with a specific interest in community-based print journalism **OR** agricultural communications.
- *Special consideration will be given to essay question response and student's involvement in their local community newspaper, or student newspaper.*

This application is for JOURNALISM or AG COMMUNICATION students

1. It is proposed to award \$2,000 scholarships for the 2024 school year to qualified graduates of Nebraska high schools enrolled or planning to enroll in post-secondary educational programs at a college and university **with an interest in community-based journalism or ag communications.**
2. Those eligible to apply are upcoming 2024 Nebraska high school graduates who are now seeking to enroll in colleges and universities. Enrollment must be on a full-time basis. The recipient must use the scholarship and enroll no later than the start of the third semester after the awarding of the scholarship.
3. **The scholarships will be given to students with a specific interest in news, editorial, sports, photography, circulation, production/design or marketing/advertising careers at a weekly, semi-weekly, or daily newspaper. The educational institution involved must offer a curriculum which provides the necessary education so a student graduating from the program is qualified for at least an entry level position in community-based journalism or ag communications.**
4. Selection of the recipients will be based on scholastic ability, essay question response, and student's involvement in their local community newspaper, or student newspaper. The decision of the NPA Foundation Scholarship Committee is final and not subject to review.
5. A letter of reference from the applicant's community newspaper publisher or editor may accompany the application, but this is not a requirement in order to be considered. **A statement from a high-school administrator, guidance counselor, or college counselor is required and a letter of reference from an unrelated party (employer, clergy, coach, etc.) is also required.**
6. 2024 scholarship funds will be paid in January 2025 (once recipient's required payout documents have been received by Nebr. Press Assn.) Funds will go directly to the college or university for deposit into the student's account) upon satisfactory completion of the first semester and proof of second semester enrollment. Unused scholarships must come to Foundation Board for decision to renew and to see if rules have been met.
7. The application form must be filled out by the applicant and an essay must be provided (pg. 2 of application). Mail or email to the NPA Foundation Scholarship Committee, c/o Nebraska Press Association, 845 "S" Street, Lincoln, NE 68508; email to nebpress@nebpress.com. **Applications must be postmarked by Friday, January 19, 2024. Scholarship award recipients will be notified in early March.**
